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Nomination & Application

Number of Exchange Students per Academic Year

According to the Agreement between NTUCE and the partner, the number can be modified if both sides agree.

Length of Exchange

One semester or one academic year, as indicated in the Agreement.

Eligibility

1. Either undergraduate or graduate students, or both, as indicated in the Agreement.
2. Students with only Taiwanese nationality are not eligible.
3. Students should meet either [English or Chinese language proficiency](#):
 - English language proficiency of at least CEFR B2 (e.g. TOEFL iBT: 72 or 4; IELTS: 5.5)
 - Chinese language proficiency of at least CEFR B1 (e.g. TOCFL Band B Level 3; HSK Level 5)

- Second (Spring 2027) Semester Entry: **by Oct 15, 2026** (mid-October)

Course Selection

1. Course schedule for [First/Second Semester](#) is made available online at the beginning of [August/January](#); online course selections begin 2-3 weeks prior to the beginning of each semester.
2. We recommend that students **formulate a preliminary study plan based on course offerings from the previous academic year**, and adjust it accordingly once the latest course schedule becomes available. If a required course was offered in the same semester last year, it is generally expected to be offered again; however, elective courses may vary from year to year.

Course Load

1. Exchange students are required to take at least 2 courses or 4 credits per semester.
2. Students should also follow the requirements of their home universities.

Course Restrictions

Course enrollment at NTU is subject to course availability, capacity limits, and course-specific regulations. Because **enrollment in your preferred courses cannot be guaranteed, incoming students must maintain flexible study plans** with alternative options. Furthermore, exchange students are restricted from enrolling in certain courses, such as GMBA and Practice/Internship courses. Please be sure to review all course-specific restrictions prior to submitting your course plan.

Accommodation

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Due to limited space, the dormitory is no longer guaranteed. We will make reasonable effort to provide advice on finding accommodation.

Language and Visa Requirements

Chinese Language Courses

1. All incoming exchange students are eligible to take General Chinese language courses.
